## BINGHAM UNIVERSITY IS HOST OF “STOP TUBERCULOSIS” PUBLIC SYMPOSIUM

**B**ingham University recently hosted a public symposium organized by stop TB partnership in Nigeria. The event was graced by several dignitaries and notable intellectuals as well as experts in the health sector.

The Ag Vice-Chancellor, Prof William B. Qurix, OFR while delivering his welcome address, stressed that tuberculosis was a ravaging problem in the health sector and the gathering presented a great opportunity in getting the right people to address the problem. He noted that “even though we are a small University, we have what others do not have which is a good research centre”. Prof Qurix added that the ministry of health had written the University for the use of its centre to carry out tests on Tuberculosis. He urged participants to do

their best to come up with a communiqué that will boost the fight against tuberculosis.

In his remarks, the board chairman, stop TB partnership, who also doubles as the Director Zankli Research Centre, Bingham University, Prof. Lovett Lawson, stated that despite the tremendous progress made in the fight against TB in Nigeria, a huge burden of TB still remains. Prof Lovett said “of the global TB death, Nigeria is far worse affected than any other country in Africa. Our case detection rate of 20% is one of the lowest in the world, which translates to 80% of infected cases ravaging communities”.

He further noted that TB was most prevalent in the adolescents and young people who form the productive group of any nation. He added that “It is therefore for this reason that we are here today to engage you in the fight to end TB and ask for your commitment to a TB free Nigeria and indeed the world”.

The Chairman, House committee on Aids, Tuberculosis, Leprosy and Malaria control, Hon Davemetics Ombugadu said that tuberculosis was a disease discovered in 1884 but was responsible for the death of over three million people annually. He emphasised that both the young and old can join hands together in the fight against tuberculosis. He pointed out that three hundred and thirty four million dollars was needed to halt the marauding disease. Hon Davemetics concluded by lauding Prof. Lovett Lawson for contributing towards the fight against tuberculosis and stressed the need for capacity building if the fight against Tuberculosis was to be won. He pledged his support as well as that of the parliament in the fight against tuberculosis.

On his part, the representative of the Chief Executive Officer, Institute for human virology (IHVN), Dr. Ernest Ekong, appreciated Bingham University's contribution toward the fight against tuberculosis and lauded the research centre for the giant strides it was making. Dr Ekong added that “Tuberculosis kills about two million people yearly and diagnosing the disease itself is a major challenge”. He also stressed the importance of proper and due intake of drugs by infected persons.

In a keynote address entitled “Challenges of TB epidemic and the roles of Academic institutions towards a TB free Nigeria”, the Honourable Minister Of Health, Prof. Isaac Folorunsho Adewole, FAS, who was represented by the permanent secretary, Ministry of Health Mr Clement, Uwaifo, lamented the rating of Nigeria by the World Health Organisation as second amongst high TB burdened countries in Africa and seventh globally. He added that one major factor that has made the disease thrive in the country is the limited knowledge of the disease by Nigerians. He continued by saying “I want to congratulate the stop TB Partnership and Bingham University for organising this symposium”. He highlighted four ways by which academic institutions could assist the country in reducing the epidemic which included research, provision of quality data for TB project improvement, building skilled and capable work force, establishment of robust laboratories, supporting development and maintenance of TB laboratories. Mr Uwaifo stated that the new W.H.O End TB strategy was adopted by the country in 2016 and it is centred on three pillars, which include the integrated patient-centred care and prevention, bold policies and support systems, and intensified research and innovation. He emphasised that the academia had a role to play in the area of research and innovation towards ending TB in Nigeria.

He continued by saying “I am pleased to inform you that Bingham University, which serves as one of the 12 TB reference laboratories in the country is one of the few facilities in Nigeria with the Gene-xpert MTB/RIF machines. I would like to appreciate the management of this great institution for effectively collaborating with the federal ministry of health in

ensuring the provision of TB reference laboratory services in the University”. Mr Uwaifo implored all attendees to join the fight against the disease by disseminating information on TB to their loved ones. The Wife of the Governor of Nasarawa State and the special guest of honour for the event, Dr. Mairo Tanko Almakura, stated that she was thrilled to participate in the drive for a T.B free world. She added that tuberculosis was one of the deadliest diseases affecting humanity. Dr (Mrs) Almakura went on to say

“Tuberculosis is preventable and curable, Government and other partners have initiated programmes to halt this disease and so far the result has been positive”. The Governor’s wife charged all individuals in attendance to join hands with the Nasarawa state government and the Federal government to end Tuberculosis in Nasarawa state and Nigeria as a whole.

#### THE AMERICAN PHYSIOLOGICAL SOCIETY AND BINGHAM UNIVERSITY CO-HOST WORKSHOP ON MEASUREMENT OF VASCULAR AND SMOOTH FUNCTIONS

The American Physiological Society and Bingham University co-hosted a workshop on measurement of vascular and smooth functions using PowerLab and LabChart instruments for experiments that lasted 3 days at the Physiology Department of Bingham University, Karu.

At the opening ceremony Dr. (Mrs) A. M. Danborn, the Head, Department of Physiology expressed her gratitude to the Management of Bingham University for approving the hosting of the workshop. She welcomed the participants, Heads of Department, Deans of Faculty and resource persons to the workshop. She stated that the workshop was the first of its kind to hold in Nigeria.

Dr. Danborn implored participants to make good use of the opportunity to learn, adding that it was “a rare privilege to be among the few selected out of hundreds of applicants”.

The Director, Zankli Research Centre, Prof. Lovett Lawson, in his remarks appreciated Dr. Danborn and her team for working hard to organize the workshop in conjunction with the American Physiological Society. He implored the successful applicants to see the workshop as an avenue to acquire invaluable knowledge. Resource persons were drawn from various Nigerian universities, amongst which were, Prof. F. B. O. Mojiminiyi of the Usman Danfodio

University, Sokoto, who made a presentation on “new techniques and approaches in vascular and smooth muscle experiments”. He also did hands-on demonstrations on how to harvest the aorta, carotid artery and the formal vein in laboratory animals, a procedure often described as difficult.

Prof. T. O. Olurise of the Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria made a presentation on “laboratory maths and dosage calculations”. He emphasized that for a researcher to conduct successful experiments and research, he must be able to apply the knowledge of dosage calculations in administering the different treatments both for in *vivo* and in *vito* studies.

Associate Prof. B. Danborno, of the Ahmadu Bello University Zaria, on his part made a presentation on introduction to PowerLab and LabChart”. He explained how some laboratory equipment such as physiography, kynography, spirometer, peak flow meter and ECG machines had been reduced to a small portable machine called the PowerLab machine. He also gave a talk on the use of invertebrates as research model organisms.

Another resource person, Dr. Lucy John Africa of the National Institute of Pharmaceutical Research and Development, made a presentation on “application of isolated tissue systems for

drug discovery in resource limited settings”. Participants were taught how to run research successfully with limited resources, especially as there is little or no funding for research in Nigeria.

Dr (Mrs) A. M. Danborno rounded up the workshop by demonstrating to the participants how to capture data using the Powerlab machine and how to calculate and interpret results using LabChart.

Participants at the workshop were M.Sc. and PhD students and senior academics drawn from Baze University, Abuja, Nile University, Abuja, Ahmadu Bello University, Zaria, Federal University Lafia, Abubakar Tafewa Balewa University, Bauchi, amongst others.
